## Outreach Vehicles (F1 - F5)

An outreach vehicle is a vehicle used principally to provide personalized library services to individuals and groups at remote locations. The vehicle does not have an organized collection separate as in the case of a bookmobile. Staff will deliver and pick-up library materials specifically for patrons who are for any reason unable to visit the library in person. An outreach vehicle may also be used for programming at daycare centers, schools, senior centers, etc.

## Library Staff (J1- J09)

Report figures as of the last day of the fiscal year. Include all positions funded in the library's budget whether those positions are filled or not. To ensure comparable data, 40 hours per week has been set as the measure of full-time employment (FTE). For example, 60 hours per week of part-time work by employees in a staff category divided by the 40 -hour measure equals 1.50 FTEs.

## To calculate FTEs for seasonal workers, I would use the following example:

- Two three month workers ( .25 of year) work 15 hours a week, so
- $15+15=30 \mathrm{hrs} / \mathrm{wk}$
- $30 / 40=.75$ FTEs
- $.75 * .25=.1875$ FTE for entire year (based on working only three months)
